

Week 5

2 Timothy 3:16 - All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It straightens us out and teaches us to do what is right.

2 Peter 1:20-21 - Above all, you must understand that no prophecy in Scripture ever came from the prophets themselves or because they wanted to prophesy. It was the Holy Spirit who moved the prophets to speak from God.

Isaiah 30:8 - Now go and write down these words concerning Egypt. They will then stand until the end of time as a witness to Israel's unbelief.

Jeremiah 30:1-2 - The Lord gave another message to Jeremiah. He said, "This is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says: Write down for the record everything I have said to you, Jeremiah.

John 5:39 - "You search the Scriptures because you believe they give you eternal life. But the Scriptures point to me!

Luke 24:25-27 - Then Jesus said to them, "You are such foolish people! You find it so hard to believe all that the prophets wrote in the Scriptures. Wasn't it clearly predicted by the prophets that the Messiah would have to suffer all these things before entering his time of glory?" Then Jesus quoted passages from the writings of Moses and all the prophets, explaining what all the Scriptures said about himself.

John 6:63 - It is the Spirit who gives eternal life. Human effort accomplishes nothing. And the very words I have spoken to you are spirit and life.

Psalms 119:152 - I have known from my earliest days that your decrees never change.

Psalms 119:160 - All your words are true; all your just laws will stand forever.

1 Peter 1:25 - But the word of the Lord will last forever." And that word is the Good News that was preached to you.

1 Peter 2:2 - You must crave pure spiritual milk so that you can grow into the fullness of your salvation. Cry out for this nourishment as a baby cries for milk,

John 14:26 - But when the Father sends the Counselor as my representative-and by the Counselor I mean the Holy Spirit-he will teach you everything and will remind you of everything I myself have told you.

Luke 11:28 - He replied, "But even more blessed are all who hear the word of God and put it into practice."

James 1:22 - And remember, it is a message to obey, not just to listen to. If you don't obey, you are only fooling yourself.

Proverbs 2:1-5 - My child, listen to me and treasure my instructions. Tune your ears to wisdom, and concentrate on understanding. Cry out for insight and understanding. Search for them as you would for lost money or hidden treasure. Then you will understand what it means to fear the Lord, and you will gain knowledge of God.

Proverbs 3:1,3 – (1) My child, never forget the things I have taught you. Store my commands in your heart, (3) Never let loyalty and kindness get away from you! Wear them like a necklace; write them deep within your heart.

Proverbs 7:1-3 - Follow my advice, my son; always treasure my commands. Obey them and live! Guard my teachings as your most precious possession. Tie them on your fingers as a reminder. Write them deep within your heart.

Joshua 1:8 - Study this Book of the Law continually. Meditate on it day and night so you may be sure to obey all that is written in it. Only then will you succeed.

Psalms 1:2 - But they delight in doing everything the Lord wants; day and night they think about his law.

Psalms 119:15 - I will study your commandments and reflect on your ways.

Acts 17:11 - And the people of Berea were more open-minded than those in Thessalonica, and they listened eagerly to Paul's message. They searched the Scriptures day after day to check up on Paul and Silas, to see if they were really teaching the truth.

Psalms 119:36 - Give me an eagerness for your decrees; do not inflict me with love for money!

Psalms 119:27 - Help me understand the meaning of your commandments, and I will meditate on your wonderful miracles.

John 8:47 - Anyone whose Father is God listens gladly to the words of God. Since you don't, it proves you aren't God's children."

Romans 10:17 - Yet faith comes from listening to this message of good news-the Good News about Christ.

Proverbs 7:1-3 – See Above

Hebrews 4:2 - For this Good News-that God has prepared a place of rest-has been announced to us just as it was to them. But it did them no good because they didn't believe what God told them.

2 Timothy 3:16 – See Above

Hebrews 4:12 - For the word of God is full of living power. It is sharper than the sharpest knife, cutting deep into our innermost thoughts and desires. It exposes us for what we really are.

John 8:31-32 - Jesus said to the people who believed in him, "You are truly my disciples if you keep obeying my teachings. And you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

Psalms 119:11 - I have hidden your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you.

Psalms 119:165 - Those who love your law have great peace and do not stumble.

Acts 20:32 - "And now I entrust you to God and the word of his grace-his message that is able to build you up and give you an inheritance with all those he has set apart for himself.

Luke 8:11,14 - "This is the meaning of the story: The seed is God's message. (14) The thorny ground represents those who hear and accept the message, but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the cares and riches and pleasures of this life. And so they never grow into maturity.

Matthew 4:1-11 - Then Jesus was led out into the wilderness by the Holy Spirit to be tempted there by the Devil. For forty days and forty nights he ate nothing and became very hungry. Then the Devil came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, change these stones into loaves of bread." But Jesus told him, "No! The Scriptures say, 'People need more than bread for their life; they must feed on every word of God.'" Then the Devil took him to Jerusalem, to the highest point of the Temple, and said, "If you are the Son of God, jump off! For the Scriptures say, 'He orders his angels to protect you. And they will hold you with their hands to keep you from striking your foot on a stone.'" Jesus responded, "The Scriptures also say, 'Do not test the Lord your God.'" Next the Devil took him to the peak of a very high mountain and showed him the nations of the world and all their glory. "I will give it all to you," he said, "if you will only kneel down and worship me." "Get out of here, Satan," Jesus told him. "For the Scriptures say, 'You must worship the Lord your God; serve only him'" Then the Devil went away, and angels came and cared for Jesus.

Psalms 119:11 – See Above
